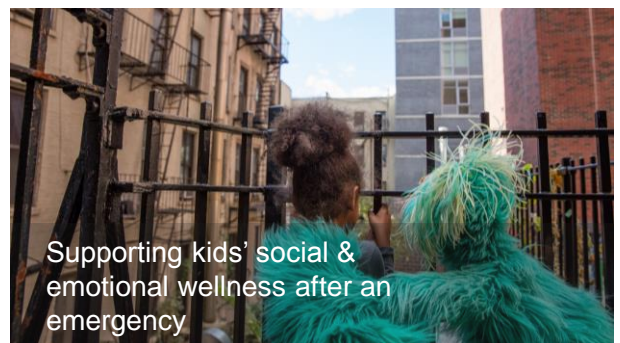

## The Sesame Approach: Difficult Times

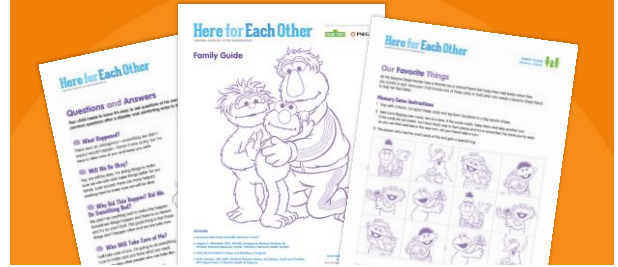
- Present a child's perspective

### Introduction



- Resiliency and preparedness program for elementary-age children
- Hosted in communities impacted by disaster and other collective trauma
- Partner with local organizations to host Camp Noah in their community




 **CAMP NOAH**

### Why Camp Noah?



- Children are uniquely impacted by disaster and other traumatic events
- Disaster can have long-term emotional and behavioral impacts on children
- Interventions are needed at multiple points - Camp Noah meets the needs of children during recovery

 **CAMP NOAH**

### Why Camp Noah?

- Scared and Vulnerable
- Sad or Grieving
- Sleep Disturbances
- Aggressive Behavior
- Obsessed with Weather
- Anxious and Worried
- Many children experiencing difficulty post-disaster may demonstrate no observable changes.

**CAMP NOAH**

### How It Works


- 5-Day Day Camp
- 1-Week After School Program
- 2-Week After School Program



**CAMP NOAH**

### How It Works

- Daily Curriculum
- Supplies & Materials
- Volunteers
  - Team Leader and Certified Camp Staff;
  - Site Coordinator and Coordinating Organization;
  - Mental Health Professional



**CAMP NOAH**

### The Impact

- *"One of the things that really happens that's amazing, is that children in a group setting care for each other. Adults that are there are caring for them and supporting them, but they are also caring for each other and showing each other that they are not alone."*

### The Impact

- *"Each day my son learned something new and was very interested and excited about sharing his day. He shares with me how to stay calm."*

### The Impact

- “[Camp Noah] opened adults’ eyes to how impacted children really are. A lot of people just thought kids are okay, because everyone was so focused on rebuilding. They were not realizing that behavioral issues might have been related to [the] trauma of flooding, seeing friends lose their homes.” (Certified Camp Staff)
